BORDENTOWN CITY RECYCLING RESOURCE GUIDE

Curbside Recycling Pickup in Bordentown City (Single Stream)

Burlington County Regional Recycling Program offers curbside pickup every second Monday. Materials include paper and cardboard, aluminum and steel/tin food and drink cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic containers with #1, 2, or 5, and cartons. Free recycling buckets for City residents are available at City Hall (324 Farnsworth Ave) and Public Works Dept. (209 Crosswicks St).

Recycling Drop-Off – Bordentown City

The City Public Works Department (609-298-0654) accepts drop-off of recyclable materials at the Gilder Field complex (209 Crosswicks St) on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 7 am to noon. Materials include glass, aluminum, paper, cardboard, concrete, brick, brush, leaves, asphalt, wood, motor oil, light iron, heavy metal, car batteries, household paint cans. No commercial contractors are permitted. Proof of city residency required.

Other Recyclable Items:

Compact Fluorescent Light Bulbs (CFLs)

Bordentown City does not collect CFLs. Other options include:

Home Depot – Bring in any expired, unbroken CFL bulbs in a plastic bag. Deposit in receptacle near the entrance. For more information:

Electronic Waste

Bordentown works with **Goodwill Industries** to help you dispose of televisions, computers, monitors, printers, fax machines, keyboards, mice, and other electronic devices and accessories. The items can be taken to the electronic recycling trailer behind Carslake Community Center and Gilder Field (209 Crosswicks St). City residents can drop off there on Saturdays from 8am to noon. There is no charge for this service. For more information, call 609-298-0654.

Yard Waste

(See “Recycling Drop-Off – Bordentown City”) Public Works also provides curbside pickup of yard waste on Wednesdays (weather permitting).

Refrigerators/Freezers

NJ’s Clean Energy Program promotes responsible recycling of refrigerators and freezers by offering \$50 cash incentive. Appliances must be working and between 10 & 30 Cu. Ft. To arrange free pick-up call 877-270-3520. You’ll save up to \$150 a year by replacing an old refrigerator/freezer and can get an additional \$50 credit for certain new units.

Printer Ink Cartridges

Plastic Shopping Bags

Acme, ShopRite, Superfresh and Whole Foods stores have drop-off receptacles at their entrances.

Cell Phones

Whole Foods, Radio Shack, Best Buy, Office Depot and Staples Accept. Other charitable organizations have a need for phones as well.

Televisions

Besides the Recycling Center behind Gilder Field, TVs can be brought to **Best Buy**, **Office Depot** (for a small charge), or the **Burlington Co. Resource Recovery Complex** in Mansfield (special drop-off days – 609-499-1001)

Rechargeable Batteries

Best Buy, **Home Depot**, **Radio Shack**, **Staples**. These kind of batteries are recyclable: Nickel Cadmium (NiCad), Nickel Metal Halide (NiMH), Lithium Ion (Li-ion), small sealed lead (pb).

Magazines

Whole Foods in Princeton donates used magazines for re-use. Or you can include magazines and paperback books in regular paper recycling pick-up.
